Introduction

FareShare

2008 Homelessness Survey

Despite some last minute panics, the survey seems to have gone well. We don't have the results yet, but hope to have at least initial results available at the next meeting.

Graham did send Paul details of the teams, but the information arrived too late for Paul to contact the people involved.

Val reported that the Breakfast Run at the end of the week still found lots of people who had not completed the survey earlier in the week, which implies that however many results we have, we still do not have information about most of the homeless

people in Bristol. The size of the problem is much larger than we can demonstrate directly with our statistics.

Homelessness Strategy Review

Ailsa was again not present to report on this item. It will be held over to the next meeting. However, it seems that there is very little to report beyond the content of the email that Paul passed on the BFH email list some time ago.

Wet Centre

We are not aware of any progress with this project.

Information Share

Bristol Methodist Centre

Debbie reported that, apart from her, the entire staff team has changed. They are now looking forward to a period of greater stability! Debbie is now the Senior Support Worker. They are now seeking to rebuild links with other organisations in the area.

Food had not been provided on Sundays for a while, but it started again last week, and should be provided every week from now on.

Churches Together in Clifton, Cotham and Redland

There was not a great deal to report. The breakfast and lunch runs are continuing.

The annual Homelessness Service organised by the Churches Together in Clifton, Cotham and Redland will be held on Sunday 6 April, starting at 6:30 pm at Hope Chapel: contact Val or Paul if you need directions. Everyone is welcome.

Crisis Centre Ministries

CCM appointed the new member of staff: Lisa started working as the new Assistant Coffee Shop Manager at the beginning of March, and is already making a significant contribution to the ministry. As a result of the appointment, the Coffee Shop is now open every week day, Monday to Friday, from 11 am to 2:30 pm, as well as the existing evening sessions (Monday to Thursday, 8 to 10 pm, plus the Life Recovery Group on Fridays).

There is also a new session, 'Home Church', running on alternate Saturday evenings: prayer, worship, and a small amount of food. CCM is looking for another group to run Home Church on the other alternate Saturdays.

Following the difficulty with Potters House reported at the previous meeting, CCM experienced something similar: a group of people from Potters House were standing outside the Coffee Shop while it was open, handing out sandwiches. Alan, the Coffee Shop Manager, prayed about it, and went out to chat with them. He encouraged them to feed the homeless, but asked that they don't do it outside our shop as we don't want to upset the neighbours by giving our clients a reason to hang around outside.

Alan invited them to come in and find out what CCM does, and as a result he and Paul had a meeting with the Pastor and Youth Leader a few days ago. This went well, and they are now talking about working alongside the other groups serving homeless people in Bristol. It now looks like we should be able to build a good relationship with them in the near future.
